- Vicki Pelham, Dixon Street, inquired about the possibility of a dog park in Woodmont seeing how many residents have dogs. Warden Bonessi said at the current time there is no space for it, the Board can investigate but suggests using the city park until more information can be gained.
- Unknown resident, asking who complains about late night activity at the basketball courts and field should be reported to. Warden Bonessi stated those are city properties so the Milford Recreation Department and Police Department would be the contacts.
- Tim Phelan, Kings Highway, is looking for a trial run of speeding trailer and possible police placement on Kings Highway as speeding continues to increase. If there is confirmation that speeding is happening is there a long-term permanent solution like speed bumps, etc. A conversation continued as to possible ways to address speeding on Kings highway starting with the speeding trailer being first.
